

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WHAT TO EXPECT:

Visit the Fort de Vaux. Hit by nearly 8,000 shells a day between Marchand June 1916, itsymbolizes the Verdunsoldiers' resistance. Inaugurated in 1932, Douaumont Ossuary, a symbol of Franco-German reconciliation, contains the remains of 130,000 soldiers.

Head to the Vauquois Ridge: its huge craters are the result of mine warfare. Gaining this strategic location caused huge human losses. It still has a unique atmosphere.

Try a Verdun sugared almond: How did this sweet treat become the symbol of celebration? To find out, we visit Verdun, home of the sugared almond.

Camp Marguerre + Dusey Canon: a concrete barrack, it was used to test the material's strength. The canon will give you an idea of that long-range weapon's power.

Bastogne War Museum + Mardasson: using a range of museum techniques with a particular focus on the Battle of the Bulge, the museum is a call to intelligence and emotions. It gives the feeling that WW conflicts still impact YOUR own history. Not far from here is the Mardasson Memorial, a major remembrance site.

National Military History Museum, Diekirch (MNHM): because war spares no lives, the MNHM seeks to represent the various nationalities who took part in the Battle of the Bulge. teil.

Visit to the National Brewery Museum in Wiltz: explore the fascinating world of water, hops and malt in a new light.

Clervaux + Battle of the Bulge Museum: a history-filled walking tour through the heart of the town, presenting the museum within the Château de Clervaux. Follow the Smugglers' Trail in Troisvierges

Baugnez 44 Museum: remembering the tragic Baugnez/
Malmedy massacre, where 84 American prisoners lost their


Explore the dragon's teeth: concrete structures designed to prevent the advance of motorized vehicles.

Visit to Spa + free time: In the heart of the spa town, the German army's headquarters, discover the official and unofficial history of the peace negotiations following Wilhelm II's abdication.

Fort Eben-Emael: Where on 10 May 1940, a small German parachute unit took control of the fort's artillery in less than fifteen minutes.

Liège: "They fought for our freedom" guided tour. Based on the exploits of a World War I resistant, this tour of Liège's historic heart, the Citadel, celebrates the bravery of our soldiers and Resistance members during both world wars.









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
